Dear Friends,

In the Bible, particular places were of great spiritual significance to God's people. The Old Testament speaks of the Tabernacle – a tent where Moses met with God, as the people of Israel travelled from Egypt to the Promised Land.

Later, the Temple was hugely significant for the people. At the Temple, animal sacrifices were made, to remind the people that sin is serious. This pointed forward to Jesus' sacrifice of himself, for our sins – a sacrifice that was made "once, for all".

As we return to the church building, for both services and private prayer, I hope it will be of spiritual help to many of us. It's not that there is a particular "magic" thing about being in church, because we can meet with God anywhere at any time. But there can be something special about being in God's house with God's people.

In the New Testament, we are told about the Holy Spirit who indwells us and goes with us. At one point, Paul speaks of our bodies being a temple of the Holy Spirit. And we are told to "draw near to God and he will draw near to you." (James 4:8)

So whether you feel able to join us in church, or worship with us online, I hope you will sense God's presence and God's blessing.

If you are coming into church, for a service or private prayer, will need to comply with the following:

- 1. That you have not had COVID-19 symptoms in the last 14 days (fever, continuous cough, loss of sense of smell or taste)
- 2. That you are fit to attend the church, in line with government guidance on shielding and isolating
- 3. That you agree to maintain a 2 metre social distance from others and to wear a face covering in church, unless exempt
