**Mission of the Month: Chain Foundation** was set up to deal with the high number of children who were left orphaned in Uganda and to assist with the health and education of others in the area. Today, the Chain Foundation have a Home for Children, farms which help make produce to keep the foundation self-sufficient and schools for all ages and abilities including the blind. The children utilize devotions that are held every evening to know more about Jesus' love and also strengthen their covenant with God.

We are intending to start a **monthly men's Bible study** on Thursday 15th (not 18th, as given last week!) February at 7.30pm in the Mulberry Tree (where we had our last men's breakfast).
