

## **Changed lives**

Dear Friends,

One book that had a profound effect on me as a teenager was "The Cross and the Switchblade". It is the true story of David Wilkerson, a country pastor in the United States in the 1950s.

He felt a strong calling from God to go to New York to share the good news of Jesus with teenage gang members. At the time, there were numerous street gangs. The gang members were heavily into drugs and involved in violent fights, robberies and murders.

David Wilkerson showed huge faith and courage in going, and God worked in amazing ways. I would highly recommend "The Cross and the Switchblade", if you haven't read it yet.

David Wilkerson and his team managed to buy a building in New York, called the Teen Challenge Centre, where gang members could go on a residential programme to come off their drug and alcohol dependence.

Teen Challenge UK is a Christian charity and has a number of centres around the country to help people who have developed life controlling problems, especially drug and alcohol addictions.

I am delighted that we will be having a Teen Challenge Team from Ilford in London coming to our 10am service on Sunday 9th February. They will be taking most of the service and will be showing a video of the work, singing, speaking and sharing testimonies about how Jesus has helped them with drug and alcohol addiction.

It will be suitable for young people from Year 6 upwards – we will have our usual Junior Church for younger children.

Whether or not you are a regular 10am service attender, can I encourage you to join us on Sunday 9th February to hear about how God has been changing lives? Also, is there anyone you could invite to join us on 9th February? It is a Sunday not to be missed!

## **NEWS FROM OUR MISSION PARTNERS**

Jirka and Keira Kralovi have had a busy summer and autumn.

- They went to two summer camps for young people to teach the Christian faith.
- In Olomouc (a university city in the east Czech Republic) they work with students. This autumn, 16 people signed up for the Czech version of 'Christianity Explored'. (It gets everywhere! That can't be bad!)
- A church in Olomouc is allowing the use of their premises to the group students that Jirka has gathered.
- Remembering how secularism has taken over the countries of Europe, it is good to hear the Kralovis report that students are coming to Bible studies. Jirka is keen that they should learn about Jesus Christ and all that he has done for us.
- The Kralovi family organised a weekend away in November as part of their programme of teaching the Bible to their students.
- On top of all this, Jirka is teaching future Czech church leaders at the Czech Bible Institute.

## **FAMILY**

 Simeon, who we met when they came to visit us, broke his leg in two places. He has spent a lot of time in hospital and rehabilitation and has made real progress.

## **POINTS TO PRAY FOR**

- Please pray for the students that Jirka and Keira meet that they will come to know Jesus Christ.
- Remember Christian young people who are in a tiny minority in the Czech Republic that they will grow in their Christian faith and not fall away.
- For Jirka: please pray for his vital role in evangelising students as well as teaching them about Jesus Christ. Also please pray for his role in training future Czech church leaders at the Czech Bible Institute.
- For Keira: Pray for her as she welcomes students and at the same time runs a home and looks after her family. Thank God for Simeon's recovery.

I echo that truth.

Thank you for the holiday gift, and I can now choose a break that is not during school holiday times. In 1972 I went to the Lake District with a group of pupils from the school where I was teaching, and I thought,

'Wow! I'm coming back!'

Well, better late than never I guess, and it looks like 2020 is the time.

#### **BELL RESORATION UPDATE**

The work on the bells is progressing steadily. On Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> January 2 engineers from White's paid a visit to the bell chamber to take measurements of the bell frame to ascertain how the new headstocks will fit into the existing layout.

Fund raising is slowly edging towards the target, to this end you can help us in Tesco's with the community project fund by taking the blue tokens at the checkout and voting for the Bell Project at the Bags of Help position. This can be done in all Braintree's main stores and at Tesco Local.

## **AUTUMN OUTING**

This was on Saturday 14th September 2019 based around Hertford. I have checked my records and find I have omitted to report on this annual event. I hope my notes jog my memory of what I recall was a very enjoyable day.

We started our day on the 6cwt 6 bells at St. John the Baptist Great Amwell. Here we rang 6 methods. My notes tell me that when preparing to ring Stedman Double I forgot that I was the conductor and so to the other ringers surprise the method did not get started very quickly.

Onto St. Andrews Hertford. Here we rang and coped well with the I5cwt 8 ringing 5 Triples and Major methods. When we got back to our cars we were over the time limit, but our Deputy Master, Debbie Hill, fluttered her eyelids at the Traffic Warden and he let us off.

It was then St. Mary the Virgin Ware with 8 bell and a 21cwt tenor, here we rang 6 methods. These bells are housed in a 78ft tower with a 30ft spire built between 1372 and 1377. In 1552 there were 5 bells which were augmented to a ring of 8 in the 1730's.

### And so to lunch

We had two churches to visit in the afternoon.

The first St. John the Baptist Widford with it's 7cwt 6. We rang a mixture of the morning methods with Double Court Bob Minor as the standout method. There is an ongoing project to teach a new band of ringers here. The present church was built in the 12th century with evidence of a church in the 10th century.

Our final tower was housed in the church of St. Andrew Much Hadham with a 9cwt ring of 8. My notes tell me we rang Cambridge Surprise Major and Double Norwich Court Bob Major, two of our favourites. This has been a church shared by the Church of England and the Roman Catholic Church since the 1980's.

It had been a very happy and enjoyable occasion and our thanks go to Bradley and Debbie Hill for making all the arrangements. It went like clockwork.
