

November is the Essex Association of Change ringers Northern District Quarter Peal Month when members try to ring as many QP's in as many Towers as possible. We are trying our best at St. Michael's. Before the 6.30pm service of Evening Worship Sunday 4th November we rang 1260 changes, consisting of 240 changes each of All Saints, St. Simons, St. Martins, Grandsire Doubles and 300 of Plain Bob Doubles :-Gareth Davies I, Ellie Gray 2, Debbie Hill [c] 3, Peter Smith[c] 4, Bradley Hill [c] 5, Maurice Downs 6. Most methods, 5, for Gareth, Ellie, Debbie, Ellis and Bradley this QP was jointly conducted by Debbie, Peter and Bradley. For EACR Quarter Peal Month.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 11-11-2018

This year is the 100th anniversary of the ending of the 1st World War. To celebrate and give thanks we rang 3 times.

At 9.30am, for 10am Morning Worship we rang All Saints and Grandsire Doubles for 30mins.

Bell ringers throughout the country were asked to ring as many bells in as many towers as was possible at 12.30pm and the ringing community made a wonderful response. We rang Rounds and Call Changes, Grandsire and All Saints Doubles ringing for30mins were:- Bradley Hill, Debbie Hill, Phil Kelly, Gareth Davies, Ellis Whitehouse, Peter Smith and Pamela Ayling who has learnt to ring under the Ringing Remembers initiative which was to teach 1,400 new ringers in honour of the 1,400 ringers who died in WW1. In all about 2,700 have learnt, a great effort and a fine tribute to those ringers who lost their lives. Kath Downs I, Ellie Gray 2, Debbie Hill 3, Ellis Whitehouse 4, Peter Smith 5, Bradley Hill Icl 6, rang 540 changes St. Clements Bob Minor

Smith 5, Bradley Hill [c] 6, rang 540 changes St. Clements Bob Minor and BradleyTolled the Tenor bell prior to the 3pm Civic Service of remembrance. On Monday 12th November we rang a Quarter Peal in Celebration of the 100th anniversary of the ending of the 1914-1918 war.1320 changes St. Clements Bob Minor in 48mins. Gareth Davies 1, Ellie Gray 2, Debbie Hill 3, Ellis Whitehouse 4, Peter Smith 5, Bradley Hill [c] 6. This was 1st in method for Ellie, Ellis, Bradley and as conductor for Bradley who's glasses flew across the ringing room after about 15mins [we don't know how or why, and he's not saying] Happy Birthday for the 11th Ellie. For EACR Northern District QP Month.

Each month the Essex Association Northern District hold an advanced practice night to further the abilities of the District ringing. We host these practices at St Michael's and on November 17th 11 members attended of which 4 were from our Guild. Seven different methods were rung on 6-7-8 and 10 bells which produced some very good ringing and was very productive.

For Evening Worship on Sunday 18th November 4 of our Guild were joined by 6 others from the Association to ring 1260 changes of Plain Bob Royal in 46mins, Ellie Gray I, Debbie Hill 2, Peter Smith 3, Heather Semken 4, Kath Downs 5, Bradley Hill 6, Gareth Bennett 7, David Hengeli 8, John Taylor 9, Maurice Downs [c] 10. Congratulations to Elli for ringing her first QP on 10 bells and Gareth Bennett his 1st of Royal. Rung in celebration of Debbie's Dad and Bradley's Grandad's 90th birthday and for EACR Northern District Quarter Peal month.

Prior to Evening Worship on Sunday 25th November, we failed in an attempted QP of Stedman doubles which we will try again. To ring to Service time Ellis Whitehouse conducted 420 changes of Plain Bob Doubles. Well done Ellis.

During November and early part of December we have had some very good service and practice ringing often ringing all 10 bells with many different methods being rung. Very pleasing.

Our proposed overhaul of the bells is going along steadily with quotes for the work being acquired and grants being pursued. The DAC is to consider our Faculty application at its next meeting. It is hoped to have a small display about the bells at the museum in the near future.
