Dear Friends,

You may recall that in the autumn, the Parochial Church Council met and agreed a vision, for where we believe God is taking St Michael's Church over the coming months and years. We identified some short, medium and long term priorities and some of the short term things are starting to happen now.

We will be having **Coffee@StMichael's** on the first Thursday of each month, starting on **Thursday 7th March, 10am-12noon** in the church. All are welcome to join us for some nice refreshments and good company. This is for anyone who is around in the day, so please invite others to join us.

We have noticed that the attendance at our monthly midweek Communion has shrunk in size. We have therefore decided to make them occasional, rather than monthly. In March, there will be a Communion service on **Wednesday 6th March** (Ash Wednesday), at the later time of **IIam** (due to the school service), but we will not have the regular Communion on the second Wednesday of each month.

On **Sunday 17th March** we will have our first **All-Age Tonight**, a service which is youth-friendly (secondary school age and older), though people of all ages will be very welcome. We will be looking at some **Unlikely Heroes** and starting with the question, "Who do you trust?" Look out for more details in the notice sheet and please plan to come along, even if you don't normally attend at 6.30pm.

In addition to Coffee@StMichael's and All-Age Tonight, we are moving forward in a number of other areas, including work on our online presence (especially our website and Facebook group), holding termly seeker's courses (Life Explored this term) and improving our welcome at church.

As we seek to grow the work at St Michael's, please pray that God would be at work. God graciously chooses to act in our world through us, but things of lasting, eternal value only come from him. We have a wonderful, loving and faithful God.

MISSION OF THE MONTH MAKE JESUS KNOWN (MJK)

MJK is the operating name for St Michael's old boy Tim Cooke's evangelistic work in this country and abroad. Recent European trips have been to Slovakia (quite responsive to the gospel), the Czech Republic (unresponsive, largely atheist) and the Ukraine (very open to the gospel). In each place as in the UK the pattern is to work in schools through lessons and assemblies using music lessons on selfesteem or drug education as a means of engaging the youngsters and to end the week with an evangelistic concert inside or outside the school.

In February after a week in Coventry where some 80 plus came to the concert and 50 made a response a follow up session will be held to create a discipleship group this week. Starting tomorrow (Feb 12th) Tim and co are in a Christian ethos school in Solihull where they will do a concert at the end of each day.


To encourage and support those coming to faith in schools Tim has developed an on-line resource called Faith Gang intended to turn converts into disciples. The newly appointed Faith Gang coordinator hopes that exhibiting at the YEC Conference (Youth Evangelism Conference) will lead more churches and Youth Groups to use this programme.

In early March Tim will be preparing material for the Apps and videos for Tim's Thought for the day on YouTube and Facebook (600 hits so far) and getting ready for the Roadshow at St Michael's on **Saturday March 23rd, 7pm in Church House**, to which all are welcome. The week after they hope to be in Becket Quays school in Brentwood doing a mission.

The I Truth App which is available as a free download continues to be a valuable resource for new and longer standing Christians and those seeking. One example was used as a loop during our WWI exhibition. New segments demand a lot of time and money and MJK was very pleased to get a grant to employ an IT Truth App worker to further explore the use of this social media means of spreading the gospel. The week from 8th April the team will be in Slovakia doing follow up from the mission last October and working in schools in a town they have not been to before.

Longer term the team hope to be taking missions in Serbia Croatia Macedonia and Kosovo.

Back home please pray that discussions about working with the Police taking lessons followed up by a concert in schools in Oldham and North Wales on violence from a Christian perspective bear good fruit. If it comes off it would be a way of getting the gospel into many schools where there is no Christian message.


