

We have just had the April weekend away with university students. Its was held in a town north of Olomouc; the students came by train from the city. We had a mix of new students and ones who had come before. There were three rooms for sleeping – girls, boys and one for our family.

After the studies in the evenings, praises rang out of the meeting room. Keira and the children (who tried to get to bed early to be ready to cook and serve meals the following day) could her the beautiful sounds. We also had moving time of extended prayer together.



Despite the later evenings, morning exercise was well attended – getting some stretches in before breakfast. On the Saturday afternoon, we enjoyed relaxing together. There were games and football. The students had opportunities to make new friends and build on existing friendships, which we hope encourage them greatly in their Christian walk in years to come.

Weekly main meetings

We are continuing through a series on Acts at our main meetings on Tuesdays. The students are really getting lots out of it and taking detailed notes.

Intensive prayer

Making time for prayer can be hard. There will be three days of prayer based on the church venue we use in Olomouc. Among the main things that we be praying for is the need to reach this city with the gospel.

'Majales' – May day stall

On 6-7 May, there will be a 'Majales' event organised by Olomouc Palacky university. 'Majales' means 'celebration of spring' and is a festival especially celebrated by students. WE will have a stall there where many students walk past. It is a great opportunity to share the gospel with many people and to give out bible and leaflets. We have Gideon bibles in Czech to give out to those who are keen to know more. Please pray for good weather on this day!

Czech Bible Institute

Jirka will be teaching Ephesians and Philippians to students at the Czech Bible Institute. There are around 15 students on the course.

Evangelistic mission event
