

Confirmation

During September, we have the Right Revd Rod Thomas, Bishop of Maidstone, coming to conduct a Confirmation service at St Michael's.

But what is Confirmation? It is a service where the candidates are confirming (agreeing with) the promises that were made for them, by their parents and godparents, when they were baptised as infants (or that they made themselves as adults). These include turning away from sin (wrongdoing) and turning towards Jesus as Saviour.

The Bishop says some significant things to each of the candidates, addressing them by name and saying:

"God has called you by name and made you his own. Confirm, O Lord, your servant with your Holy Spirit."

The Bishop then asks them some potentially challenging questions, for example,

"Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?"

The answer isn't "Yes" or "I'll try my best". The answer is, "With the help of God, I will." I find this answer both realistic and helpful. In different ways, we all struggle to resist evil and do what is right at times. But if we trust in God, we are promised that the Holy Spirit will come and live in us. We resist evil only with the help of God, not in our own

strength alone. I find it a useful prayer to make my own, as I seek to serve God: "With the help of God, I will."

Would you consider supporting our Confirmation candidates in two ways? The first is to pray for them, as they publicly declare their faith.

The second is to join us for the Confirmation service – it is on Sunday 22nd September at 10am.

MISSION OF THE MONTH ACTS MINISTRY- BURKINA FASO (West Africa)

Acts in Burkina Faso works among the most vulnerable people in one of the poorest countries in the world. On the scale of poorest countries Burkina Faso is 173 out of 175. I visited Burkina Faso in 2007 and met with Joanna Ilboudo who set up Acts. Widows and orphans are the forgotten ones. They have no voice and no means of support. They are considered outcasts due to the fear of AIDS. Widows have no opportunity for education and no hope of gaining skills necessary to support a family. Without financial means, widows and orphans are caught in a cycle of poverty, sickness and ignorance!

Acts works like this:-

- I. Ellel Medical Centre which provides maternity care, maternal and child health and has a dispensary, a laboratory, pharmaceutical depot and odontology. Patient visits have been increasing year on year.
- 2. Education: It has hundreds of orphans and rural poor children in formal education; many children in vocational training; widows in micro enterprise and literacy training.
- 3. Nutrition: Acts feeds each day 850 orphans. For some children it is the only meal they have and this makes a difference in their lives.
- 4. Temple Evangelique El Rosi: Organises evangelical campaigns, trains new disciples, trains Pastors, has brought 1000 people to salvation.
- 5. Community Development which brings spiritual, economic, social and physical relief.

Acts ministers to the physical and emotional wounds of the desperate while addressing their needs.

Only God's love can make lasting change in the lives of men, women, boys and girls caught in the oppression of poverty and ignorance.

GEORGE MULLER AND HIS ORPHANS



George Muller: born Kroppenstaedt, Prussia 1805 Attended Cathedral School, Halberstadt. Entered Halle University in 1825 as a student of divinity. He moved to England in 1829 and lived in Teignmouth

He admitted to frittering his time away with fellow students, then said, 'then the time came when God would have mercy on me.'

He was a gifted intellectually. A brilliant linguist and a fine mathematician. He kept complicated accounts of institutions in Bristol. He studied Hebrew.

Going to prayer meeting with a friend he heard the gospel for the first time, "It made me happy. If I could have been asked why I was happy I could not have explained it."

He married twice, both very happy marriages. One daughter survived and one baby son, Elijah died.

Many children were left as homeless waifs on the streets he saw. He later took children into his own large house. Babies would be pressed into his arms to be cared for.

He started up five houses on Ashley Down, Bristol. Each had 15 children, a matron and house parents to make a loving family home.

He made himself responsible for the material needs of himself, his wife, his family and the orphans. By believing prayer for regular meals, clothing and education for the children. The money came in just in time to purchase bread.

George recounts, 'One day a lady visitor asked, "Mr. Muller, does God really answer prayer?"

At the time he was completely out of funds. The milkman was outside and due to be paid, he could hear the churns being handled and matron came in with the bill. (While I breath I pray.) The Lady said, "I see you are busy. Before I go, I would like to give you this," she pressed 10 sovereigns into his hands.

His reply to her question was, "You ask, does prayer save us from want? You yourself have supplied it with your kind gift."

Another well-known story:

Table laid before breakfast but no money and an empty larder. He said, "children you must be ready for school." He raised his arms and prayed, "Dear Father, thank you for what you are about to give us to eat." There was a knock on the door, it was the baker. "I could not sleep last night. I sensed you needed bread. I arose at 2 am and baked you bread. I want you to have it."

After the baker left, there was a second knock on the door. Outside stood the milkman. He had broken down outside the house and he asked if George would take the supply of milk he had left so that he could repair the wagon.

`Strains and difficulties, I expected from the beginning, but cheerfully did I pass through them for the Glory of God.

He went to be with his Lord aged 90 years. He preached his last sermon in March 1898.

People said off him: "I remember the feeling of great peace in his presence."

At age 16, once a month, I was a runner for the Air Raid Precautions (A.R.P) wardens HQ which was in Braintree Town Hall. It was an overnight job so I had a bed on the first landing half-way up the stairs. The job was to take messages to the Anti-Aircraft machine guns positioned on Lake and Elliot and Crittall towers. Also to other nongun positions. These guns opened up on low flying positions to give them a better chance of hitting these important factories. (They didn't achieve any direct hits.)


