

We will also be having another 5:15 Quiz on Zoom on Sat 6<sup>th</sup> Feb, 6.45pm for a 7pm start. And on Sat 27<sup>th</sup> Feb, 10.00am-12.30pm, we have our Men's Conference. We very much look forward to Wallace Benn leading two Bible studies about how Peter coped with failure and suffering, titled, "Peter – a Living Rockfall".

For all of these Zoom events, you can join us via a computer, tablet, smart phone, etc. – if you haven't got access to one of those, you can still join us by landline.

## MISSION OF THE MONTH CPAS

CPAS is an Anglican Evangelical mission agency working in the UK and Republic of Ireland.

Their mission is to help every person hear and discover the good news of Jesus Christ through the ministry of local churches.

They are patrons of our church. They help provide evangelical ministers to churches and also provide lots of courses for ministers, other leaders and PCC groups. They also run ventures and Falcons young people's holidays where up to 4000 children attend various camps and house parties during the summer months mainly.

This year of course was particularly difficult as venues had been booked but, in the end, had to be cancelled. However, CPAS provided and online holiday for the children sending out to them 'Falcons-in-a-box' which included all sorts of activities and the holidays were conducted online. They are Currently considering next year's ventures and Falcons and would value prayer in guidance.

Praise God for the success of virtual ventures and thank him for his provision of ideas, technology, energy, and enthusiasm in the mist of challenging circumstances. Pray that the children who received a falconin-a-box would continue to remember the generosity, kindness and teaching they received on Falcon holidays in the past.

Praise God also for the hard work and adaptability of the hundreds of volunteer leaders who dreamt up virtual games, lead Bible studies from afar, sent exciting post and built a sense of Christian community.

Praise God also for CPAS delivering a series of free web teaching series and is currently running a leadership web course entitled Leading in Uncertain Times.

They have also been doing virtual learning as well as in person sessions with social distancing, to clergy, ordinands, and MA students on a range of topics including leadership and mission.

One of the key strategic goals over the next five years is to equip 1000 ministers and focal leaders to lead and be more effective in evangelism.

A key piece of work is now underway in partnership with the Church of England and others to develop an online learning process for clergy and lay leaders to help churches see more people become disciples of Jesus. And of course, they miss the camaraderie of the office and that Friday night drink with office friends after work. It's not quite the same on zoom!

#### **'BUT HE'S DIFFERENT!'**

Rob works with a colleague who is a Muslim. He hasn't seen him for almost a year now. Rob and his friend worked well together. In office breaks, he and Rob have showed each other pictures of their respective families and children. Rob's friend has heartaches which he has told Rob about. They are both concerned about how their children are doing at school, but Rob's friend has a son who is severely disabled. Rob's understands this a little because his sister's daughter is facing endless trips to hospital.

When Rob gets home at night, he sees rioting Muslims in Paris. Yet those whose faces who appear on the screen and their chanting don't seem to fit in with Rob's colleague at work.

'That's Islam for you', says Rob's brother, Eric. 'That's what your mate is like'.

'No', says Rob. 'He is different'. In fact, Rob could put it another way: 'we both have a lot in common'

#### **FORGET FRIENDS**

Social contact is good for Rob. It breaks down his prejudices and stereotypes because he meets a colleague who doesn't fit the standard image. But the longer lock-down goes on and social contacts diminish, old prejudices may easily re-emerge.

## 'ALL JOCK TAMSON'S BAIRNS'.

Mrs T famously said that you need wealth to be a good Samaritan. That's as may be, on the other hand it may not! But social contact is of the essence. The more we know others, we may begin to understand that 'we are all Jock Tamson's bairns' as they say north of the border. We face the same heartaches and worries. We are all the same human clay. And at the same time, we are all human beings loved by God with all dark sides and mess that God loves to sort out.

#### THE MAN WHO SELF ISOLATED

You can't say that Jonah (the prophet in the Old Testament) was full of love for the Assyrians. At the end of his book, we find him choosing voluntary self- isolation. When Jonah was by himself waiting to see the destruction of his enemies, the LORD GOD spoke to him. 'Should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?' (Jonah 4:11).

We might be locked away from others, which debilitates us, but we can never be locked away from the Lord God who knows all the people that are on earth.
